New Library Building Update...

The Interior Design Committee made recommendations for color choices for carpet and paint. The FLL board was happy with most choices but wanted more options for some. The Interior Design Committee met with our representative, Jennifer, again and will present these new choices at the December FLL board meeting.

Insulation and electrical work went in during November. The New Building Walk Through held on Tuesday, November 18th went well. We had over 70 people attend during both the 2 pm and 6 pm sessions. Many commented on their appreciation of being able to take a peek at the inside of the building and how it is coming along. Many also had good questions to ask about the project and how things are proceeding, and about choices that have been made.

Director Professional Development progress:

I just recently completed my third course with UW Madison – Advanced Library Administration. I will receive my letter of completion within a week or two. The cost of this course was covered by a scholarship that I obtained through WI DPI (one time only scholarship).

I will have one more course to complete to be able to receive my Professional Library Licensure through the WI Department of Public Instruction – Public and Community Library Services.

Currently, I am licensed as a temporary licensure status. The WI DPI allows librarians to obtain a temporary license for four years in order to complete the four courses required. Once completed, I will obtain my Grade II library license. Due to the size of our community, only a Grade III is required, but due to my already holding a bachelor's degree, after completing the four courses, I will automatically qualify for Grade II.

I will be taking the fourth course in fall 2026, when it is offered. As I was hired in January 2024 and thus began my courses, I will be completing these four courses in half the required time (two years). With the building project going on, I felt it necessary to get these courses completed as soon as I could, as long as I felt I was able to dedicate the necessary focus and time to them, which I have.
